

HARVARD CREW - THE TRADITION BEGAN...

- In the Fall of 1844 The first Harvard boat club is organized by Horace Cunningham '46 and his classmates when they purchase an eight-oared boat, the Star, and re-christen it the Oneida.
- In the Fall of 1846 Harvard Crew wins its first race against an outside opponent. Members of the Class of 1847, competing in the Huron, defeat the Wave of Boston over an approximate two-mile course on the Charles River.
- On August 3, 1852 Harvard and Yale meet in America's first intercollegiate athletic event-a crew race on Lake Winnipesaukee in Center Harbor, NH. Harvard wins the two-mile contest and sets into motion a rivalry that thrives to this day.
